HAUGHLEY PARISH COUNCIL NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN LOCAL GREEN SPACES

The Parish of Haughley has several "Green Spaces" that are either on the outskirts of the village or have been incorporated into the fabric of the settlements within the Haughley Neighbourhood Plan area, which includes Haughley, Haughley New Street, Haughley Green, parts of Dagworth and parts of Tothill.

Paragraphs 76 and 77 of the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) refer to

- 76. Local communities through local and neighbourhood plans should be able to identify for special protection green areas of particular importance to them. Buy designating land as Local Green Space local communities will be able to rule out new development other than in very special circumstances. Identifying land as Local Green Space should therefore be consistent with the local plan of sustainable development and complement investment in sufficient homes, jobs and other essential services. Local Green Spaces should only be designated when a plan is prepared or renewed, and be capable of enduring beyond the end of the plan period.
- 77. The Local Green Space designation will not be appropriate for moist green areas or open space. The designation should only be used:
 - Where the green area is demonstrably special to a local community it serves;
 - Where the green area is demonstrably special to a local community and holds a particular local significance, for example because of its beauty, historic significance, recreational value (including a playing field), tranquillity or richness of its wildlife; and
 - Where the green area concerned is local in character and is not an extensive tract of land

This document provides an assessment of green spaces in the Haughley Neighbourhood Plan Area against criteria in paragraph 77 of the NPPF in order to support designation of local green spaces in the emerging Haughley Neighbourhood Plan






