HAUGHLEY WI IS ALIVE AND THRIVING

So how was this achieved? Well, what is certain is that we did not do it alone.

Haughley WI Committee, led by Marian Adams, regularly met virtually when face-to-face contact was not allowed and, in order to adhere to charity regulations, we introduced the monthly meetings in a bag initiative for the ladies in place of our meetings. There was a different educational theme and contents each time the bags were distributed. Marian prepared the bags, which were then delivered by the Committee to all the ladies with socially distanced front doorstep chats whenever possible.

However, the bags had to be paid for and since no fundraising was possible for a long time, our reserves, such as they were, began dwindling. But much to our relief, and in recognition of our key social function during the pandemic restrictions and our lost income, **Haughley Parish Council awarded Haughley WI a one-off grant of £338.**

More recently we have received another grant. This time from the **Haughley Joint Charities Trust which allocated Haughley WI a one-off grant of £125** to fund the hire of a coach to help ladies attend a Christmas Dinner on December 21.

We are truly grateful for both of these generous donations which amounted to £463. It has meant that our WI has not only survived by keeping our heads above water, but that we can continue to support our loyal ladies who kept the faith. We also ran a successful recruitment drive which has increased our membership.

Our first face-to-face meeting was a fish and chip supper social evening in July 2021. Our speakers and activities programme has been relaunched and the newly resurrected Lunch Club is a huge success. **Our membership has now swelled to 33 strong and we have welcomed 11 new members.**

HAUGHLEY NATURE WATCH

Haughley Nature Watch is a new social group, meeting once a month in the Maxwell Charnley room - next to the Post Office in Old Street. It brings together all sorts of people from the parish (and beyond) who share an interest in and love of nature in all its guises.

It was formed by Jo Ling and Molly Wallis at the beginning of the year. They noticed that there were lots of different initiatives happening in the village such as The Swift Project, The Pollinator Corridor idea, the Eco-Church Initiative, the Green-School project, Gallowsfield Woods management committee and the Bio-Diversity and Wildlife Committee. They wondered whether it was possible to join these projects up a little. They were also aware that there are lots of people who love nature who do not have the time or the inclination to join a formal management group but would like to meet like-minded people for conversation, action and fun. So Haughley Nature Watch was born with the aim of bringing Haughley people with a passion for nature together.

The group meet on the third Wednesday of the month at the Maxwell Charnley Room 6 - 8pm. There is no formal agenda, we meet to chat and to have a drink or two - tea and coffee provided, bring your own booze! November's meeting was only our third meeting, so we are still very new. So far we have organised a tree and wild flower ID day in Gallowsfield and Pam Welburn has set up an electronic system for mapping any interesting nature sights we have - such as the Red Kite that was seen flying over the village recently. Next year we hope to have speakers on a variety of subjects come to the meetings and organise visits to local places of interest.

We have discussed encouraging hedgehog highways to be formed between gardens, helping to build ponds in gardens for householders that want one but cannot construct one themselves, putting up nesting boxes for birds and bats, encouraging the growing of native wild flowers, planting hedgerows, helping with working parties and litter picking.

SBPT's Chairman, Piers Hart, will tell us about their current projects of Welnetham Windmill, Lavenham's Little Hall (in the Market Square) and Pakenham Water Mill, as well as about some of their past successes such as saving the historic brick-and-flint Brandon Railway Station from being knocked down.

Thursday, 13th January 2022; 7.30pm – "Trinity House Lighthouses" at The BLACKBOURNE's Chamberlayne Hall, Blackbourne Rd, Elmswell IP30 9UH

Speaker Simon Millyard will tell us more about Trinity House which has been providing lighthouses around England, Wales and the Channel Islands for the safety of the mariner for over 400 years. Its first lighthouse was built at Lowestoft in 1609 and, in 1836, Trinity House bought up the remaining private lighthouses, upgrading them with masonry towers and brighter lights. Today Trinity House (from its Harwich headquarters) owns and maintains 66 lighthouses around our coasts, which are renowned around the world for their innovative design, high-calibre engineering and reliability.

NEW DWELLINGS IN BACTON

Contractors have commenced the construction of a new residential development in Bacton, whilst three other significant developments are expected to commence soon after Christmas, with the construction work likely to last several years. A meeting has been held between representatives from Bacton Parish Council, County and District Councillors, three of the developers and Haughley Parish Council.

It was agreed that the respective traffic management plans would nominate the B1113 as the main haul route with access to the centre of Bacton via Clay Land and Turkey Hall Lane. This should limit the amount of construction traffic passing through Haughley, but it is almost inevitable that some related construction traffic will pass through Haughley.

Haughley Parish Council has identified areas in the Parishes of Haughley and Bacton that need to be considered carefully by the developers to minimise the impact on residents and property in the Parishes. These matters are to be considered in preparing the respective traffic management plans.

It has been agreed to continue liaison between the respective Parish Councils and developers to limit and mitigate the impact of traffic to and from the development sites on our respective Parishes.

Orchard Barn News

Orchard Barn, as the name suggests, has many apple trees and Wassailing, a tradition related to fruit trees, is one that we enjoy keeping! Historically, villagers would go Wassailing on Twelfth Night, and exactly what they did depended on local customs. Dating back to Pagan times, revellers would process around local orchards and sing traditional songs to please the spirits of the fruit trees and encourage a good harvest for the next year. Sometimes, they would shout and bang pots and pans, to scare away bad spirits from the orchard too. Afterwards the owner of the orchard would reward them with a warm, spicy alcoholic drink taken from a communal wassail bowl or cup. Wassail was a traditional Christmas and New Year toast, derived from the Anglo Saxon 'waes hael' which means 'to your health'.

The Platinum Jubilee Of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second



VILLAGE CELEBRATIONS

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee in 2022 marking Seventy Years on the Throne will be the first in British history and we hope everyone will join in to make the occasion memorable; something where we can create memories to all look back upon in fondness after the trauma of recent years.

From the time of William the Conqueror and before, 'Haughley' or 'Hagala as an ancient town and the seat of the Royal Fortress of 'Hageneth', has Proclaimed and Celebrated upon the Market Place of our now Village Green and from the Ramparts of our Ancient Castle whose origins date back beyond Saxon times to Pre-history.

As well as Coronations and Jubilees, we have celebrated the defeat of the Spanish Armada in 1588, the Gunpowder Plot and our Victories over the Dutch in the 1600s and of Waterloo and Trafalgar.

In days of old Hog Roasts, Dancing, Thanksgiving Services, Free Ale & Beverages and the Pealing of Bells were the order of the day for even the poorest soul of the Parish to enjoy.

We have celebrated Royal Weddings and Peace as well as Flower Shows, Fetes and the Street & Medieval Fairs which replicated the Ancient Toy Fairs held annually in August from medieval times till their abolition in 1871

With the advent of empire, Empire Day celebrations became an annual treat and in 1951 the Festival of Britain was celebrated. October 1973 saw the unveiling of the Village Sign by the Marquis of Aberdeenshire and a Two Day Museum to mark the 800th year since the Battle of Haughley in 1173 when rebels laid siege to the Castle.

At the Fiftieth Anniversary of the end of the Second World War in 1995 it was decided to celebrate VJ Day in August as opposed to VE Day in May; whilst the rest of the nation celebrated in 1945 most in Suffolk and Haughley were still at war in the Far East. Organised by myself and Anita Burrell, it consisted of a two day 1940s Exhibition, a Street Party, the lighting of a Beacon by the 90 year old Mr Mulley and a BBQ. It culminated in an Open Air Church Service and Firework Display from the Church Tower in front of eight hundred people. With a speech from HM the Queen broadcast live, a 'Last Night of the Prom's it ended with dancing to a Glenn Miller Band in Palmers Orchards till the early hours;

'Dotty' Edwards 'Jitterbug' became legendary!

The Millennium saw Dances & Religious Commemorations and the Church was floodlit for the first time.

Palmers Bakery's 150th Celebrations on a hot June day in 2019 were attended by three thousand people for a Funday, Village Museum and Fireworks Display; it was once of the last occasions when we all happily gathered together before the Global Coronavirus Pandemic Struck .

We pray for better things in 2022 where we can all come together safely to create happy memories for everyone.

NEW FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

The tree for life scheme has been re-launched. Applications are invited from parents to plant a tree to mark a birth or adoption between 1st January and 31st December 2021. Remembrance trees can also be applied for by parents who may have lost a child during the same period. Details are on the Council's website.

MSDC has published the draft statements on the position of the Five Year Housing Land Supply for consultation. Councils have to show Government they have a minimum of available land to meet five years worth of house-building targets. The position shows that Mid Suffolk has a supply of 9.54 years compared to 7.76 previously.

Planning Inspectors have paused the examination for the Joint Local Plan to allow MSDC to re-consult and further clarify the spatial strategy and review part of the evidence base. There are some concerns about the housing allocations, particularly the concentration of new developments along the A14 corridor, and difference in housing numbers for similar settlements. We expect the "pause" to be for 9 to 12 months.

Chairman's Column, November 2021

PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Wednesday 22nd December at 7pm. All parishioners are welcome and encouraged to attend. CAR PARK AT RON CRASCALL PAVILION

The refurbishment and resurfacing of the car park at the Ron Crascall Pavilion have been completed and the car park is open for all to use.

JUNIOR FOOTBALL PITCH

A very positive meeting was held this month with Bloor Homes. Much of what we needed to be included to accept handover of responsibility for the football pitch was achieved. We take possession in 2Q22 but the pitch is unlikely to be ready to play upon until the 2023 season.


ZEBRA CROSSING ON GREEN ROAD

The crossing is being provided for all pedestrians but specifically to provide a safe crossing place for parents and school children attending Crawford's Primary School. Haughley Parish Council supports the design and proposals, as mentioned in last month's Chairman's Column.

During the detailed design of the crossing, it was found that existing traffic speeds on Bacton Road were slightly too high for the zebra crossing. To make the crossing safer to use, traffic calming is proposed on the approaches to the crossing and at the crossing itself. The traffic calming proposals include a 6m long, full width flat top hump at the zebra crossing and two 75mm high partial width round top humps on the approaches to the zebra crossing.

The County Council has a legal duty to consult all statutory consultees where traffic calming is proposed but parishioners also have an opportunity to comment. The location of the zebra crossing, and associated traffic calming is shown in the attached PDF drawing no.0100. Also shown are the results of the recently surveyed traffic speeds. Data supporting these figures can be made available on request. The existing speeds are shown as 85thile speeds. This is the speed which is exceeded by 15% of the surveyed traffic flow. As you can see, despite the existing speed limit being signed as 30mph, repeater signs and the informal 20mph school safety speed limit, the 85thile speeds are 33mph & 34mph. Some drivers are clearly driving in excess of these speeds.

The statutory consultation period will run for approximately 3 weeks from 16/11/21 - 07/12/21 during which time you are invited to submit comments to James Prime at James.c.prime@kier.co.uk.



SPEED LIMIT ON FISHPONDS WAY

We have been advised that our proposal to move the start of the 30mph speed limit into Haughley from Tot Hill back to before Dagworth Lane on Fishponds Way, was rejected by Suffolk Highways despite a strong case being put by our County Councillor. The Council agreed to write to Suffolk Highways via our County Councillor Andrew Stringer expressing its disagreement with the decision and putting forward the case for moving the speed limit further towards Tot Hill.

FOOTPATH ON FISHPONDS WAY

The Council has received several representations, including a number made during the Public Forum of November meeting, from parishioners expressing their significant concerns about the location of the footpath by the bridge, the safety of pedestrians and the hazards of vehicles, particularly HGVs, mounting the footpath to avoid collisions. The Council have the same concerns and agreed to write to Suffolk Highways via our County Councillor Andrew Stringer expressing these concerns and to request sight of the outcome of the interim safety study that will be completed in the coming months.

An UPDATE for PARISHIONERS

Collaborating with the Biodiversity Working Group

It has been agreed that, subject to residents' approval, 2 beds (the one behind the coalhouse and the one on the triangular Green on the Folly), should become wildflower beds. If this proposal goes ahead the Biodiversity Working Group will be responsible for the care and maintenance of both beds.

An outstanding HiB project

The five wooden tubs on the green, where the Palmer's bench is sited, are due for replacement. A replacement plan was approved in March 2021 to purchase, install and plant up three large bespoke maintenance-free containers made from recycled materials. Our thanks go to the Council and District Councillor Rachel Eburne for their financial support to complete this project. The Clerk will place the order and the new containers will be stored locally free of charge until their installation takes place. Installation will depend on workforce availability and of course the weather. The hope is that this work can be carried out alongside the work to install the new parish seating. Once installed the new bespoke containers will be a major part of the Jubilee Year floral display and give us many further maintenance free years. A budget request to support the special Jubilee Year Display in 2022 has been submitted to the Parish Council.

HAUGHLEY Project Infrastructure Investment Plan (PIIP)

AN UPDATE FROM THE PIIP WORKING GROUP: November 2021

In July the Haughley PIIP was submitted to the District Council. The PIIP is supported by policy and funding application and other formal documents and a twice-yearly funding cycle. Here is a progress update:

1. **Long term:** footpath and roadside verges projects. Councillor Andy Flint remains in contact with the responsible authorities and continues to lobby on our behalf, but there is no progress to report.
2. **Medium term:** work to improve the childrens' play area on the Playing Field and enhance the Play facilities for older children on the Cricket, Haughley Green. A working party is being convened and will meet on November 22 to start taking this work forward. MSDC Planning permission is not required. Further updates will be provided.
3. **Short term:** more seating throughout the parish. Councillor Tony Monaghan, is leading this project. 14 new benches are planned for installation at various sites. See table below:

<p>1. 1.5m benches x10 made from recyclable materials on permanent bases. Once installed no maintenance will be needed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Windgap Lane x1: top of Denny Ave near notice board• St Mary's Ave x1: on Green at Fishponds end near the bin• Ladyfield x1: on Green, exact site to be determined• Playing Field perimeter x4: exact sites to be confirmed• New junior football pitch perimeter x2: exact sites to be confirmed after pitch is formally handed over to the council.• Allotment x1: exact site to be confirmed
<p>2. 1.5m teak benches x4, identical to the new bench outside the post office. Recipients responsible for installation and after care following delivery.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Gallowsfield Wood (GFW) x2• Village Hall, (VH) x2

4. **Short term:** Church clockface refurbishment to mark the 2022 Queen's platinum jubilee. Preliminary feasibility work concluded. HPC Chair, Alf Hannan

is leading this project. Diocese faculty permissions are required before work can commence and the church warden is project liaison for the application. MSDC Planning permission is not required.

5 Short term: Grade II listed Haughley War memorial refurbishment with a view to complete the work in 2022 with a rededication service. Essential preparatory work has concluded. "The Friends of the War Memorial" are leading this project. Diocese faculty permissions are required before work can commence and the church warden is project liaison for the application. MSDC Planning permission is not required.

6 New short term project: To repair the preschool playhouse roof and ensure a safe and "fit-for-purpose" facility for the local children who attend. Preschool are leading this project.

In addition to the Play Areas Project, two more local project teams are being developed: The Village Hall Garden Renovation and Tree safety work in the Churchyard. MSDC Planning permission is not required for any of these projects.

The Considered Project funding applications OUTCOMES:

At the Full parish Council Meeting on November 16, 2021 the four short term projects, listed 3-6 above, were considered and all were supported. The Parish Clerk will advise the four project leads of their CIL allocations and update the Haughley PIIP as required.

Project 3. The Parish Council led Seating Project was allocated £13,626

Project 4. The Parish Council led Church Clock Face Project was allocated £7,400

Project 5: The Friends of Haughley War Memorial led War Memorial Conservation Project was allocated £14,389.60

Project 6. The Haughley Pre-School led Playhouse Project was allocated £295

God's gift to us both in Creation and in the Son holds nothing back in investing in us, and God's promise now waits in us, we who are **P**arties to His promise, that we may fulfill that promise, the Kingdom come in our day.

Let this New Year be the year we make salvation real, for creation, and for all her children.

Buy safe to be safe

Whatever the deal, whatever the temptation, don't buy from unauthorised traders and don't borrow from unauthorised lenders. These could put you at risk of unscrupulous collection methods – including threats and harm, unsafe products and unexpectedly high interest rates. You may also not be protected by Financial Conduct Authority rules

Shop around

Try as many different places as possible to find the best price. Buy what you want and not what other people say you need. Be wary of extended warranties; the cost of a repair could be less than the cost of the warranty.




