NEWS FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

To get more homes insulated and have lower household heating bills, Mid Suffolk District Council has launched the new *Cosy Homes* initiative with a £2 million fund. Eligible households can apply for **free energy efficiency measures** in their own homes, including if privately rented. Applications are now open for this free scheme. Full details are available via www.midsuffolk.gov.uk

A separate, county-wide scheme is still available for particularly vulnerable households and this can be accessed via www.warmhomessuffolk.org

At Mid Suffolk's Council meeting on 20th November, Part 1 of the **Joint Local Plan** (JLP) for Mid Suffolk and Babergh was approved and adopted. The JLP sets out a planning framework to guide development in the districts over the period to 2037. JLP Part 1 provides a set of strategic and local development management policies against which planning applications and appeals will be assessed. There are 10 strategic policies (such as on affordable housing, climate change and tourism) and 32 local policies (such as on biodiversity, historic environment and sustainable construction). Part 2 of the JLP, which covers housing policies such as settlement boundaries and housing requirements, is being worked on and will be consulted on next year.

After Storms Babet and Ciaran, the Council has been working hard to help those who have been affected by **flooding**. Householders and business-owners are being urged to report flood damage via Suffolk County Council's reporting tool. Government has announced some financial support for affected residents and businesses and this will be available from the end of November via the District Council. If your home or business has been affected, please visit www.midsuffolk.gov.uk for full details.

HAUGHLEY PARISH COUNCIL

Haughley Parish Council held a meeting on 21 November. The Council continues to consult with the Public Rights of Way office at Suffolk County Council (SCC) with some success although this may not become apparent for several months.

C.Cllr Andrew Stringer advised that SCC is consulting on budget proposals for 2024/5, including asking Suffolk people about which services people have recently used, thoughts on seeking a greater contribution to Council Tax to help fund public services and which service area they would like to see more money spent. http://www.smartsurvey.co.uk/s/Budget24_25/

He also advised that SCC extend thanks to people around the county who helped other residents whose homes and travel were affected by the rains and flooding that struck Suffolk on Friday 20 October.

D.Cllrs Rachel Eburne and Janet Pearson confirmed that Mid Suffolk District Council and Babergh District Council confirmed approval and adoption of part 1 of the Joint Local Plan (JLP).

The Cosy Homes initiative has been launched through MSDC with a £2 million fund. Eligible households can apply for free energy efficiency measures in their own homes, including if privately rented. Full details to be available via www.midsuffolk.gov.uk.

The Parish Council considered and decided to support planning application DC/23/04859 for the erection of two storey side and rear extension at The Cottage, Haughley New Street. The Council has received confirmation that DC/23/04303 for Change of use of building to form a farm shop at Diaper Poultry Ltd, Haughley New Street, was granted.

The Council received reports from the Biodiversity and Wildlife Conservation Working Group, the Neighbourhood Plan Working Group, an update from the Gallowsfield Wood Working Group and a report relating to the proposed junior football pitch.

Preparation for the XMAS TREE LIGHTS SWITCH ON EVENT TO BE HELD SATURDAY 2 DECEMBER BETWEEN 3PM AND 5.30 pm ON THE GREEN continue and we look forward to seeing many of you at the event.

The Council has received several applications for grant funding which will be considered further as part of the considerations for setting the Parish Council Budget for 2024/5. Financial information was noted and approval given for a range of payments.

The Clerk's report identified some of the activities that have been undertaken during the last month. Correspondence received was considered and the nature of responses agreed.

Councillors raised several issues, including fly-tipping, damaged signs, the need for litter picking (this receives ongoing attention) and street lighting.

It was also reported that **further damage has been caused to tubes that form part of the vehicle count equipment for traffic counts**, the results of which the Parish Council use to help inform future proposals relating to traffic through Haughley. On a previous occasion, HGV tyre marks suggested that someone had attempted to cause damage to the tubes, on another occasion, the contractor was of the opinion that the tubes had been cut, whilst during the count week this time, two different sets of tubes were severed – all his damage being in Haughley New Street. Obviously, there are cost implications. This type of equipment is designed for use on trunk roads and therefore should be well capable of taking traffic, even a lot of heavy traffic. The equipment counts vehicles and the general size of vehicles based on their passage over the tubes, but have no means of recording any images.

The next meeting of the Haughley Parish Council is scheduled for Tuesday 19th December at the Pavilion starting at 7pm.

WI NEWS - DECEMBER 2023



The November meeting was our AGM and there have been some big changes in our Haughley WI. Our President Marian Adams has stepped down after 6 years. During her presidency she has been an inspirational leader and she took members through the particularly

Our new President Julia Brook is delighted to have the opportunity to move the organisation forward towards its centenary in 2025. She says that in particular she would like to develop further the role of our WI in the wider Haughley community and to support local causes.

COMMUNITY ORCHARD NEWS UPDATE

Haughley now has three "community orchards"; the original one adjacent to the allotments off Base Green Road at Haughley Green was planted about 15 years ago. A second one was planted in 2021 at Gallowsfield Wood and the most recent one was planted last year at the bottom of St Mary's Avenue. The original is the most formal of the orchards and is well established and produces an increasing number of dessert and cooking apples as well as a few walnuts. The other two "orchards" are more of the "scattered orchard type" and are set amongst other trees and are not yet producing fruit of a useful size. I pick some apples from the allotment orchard from time to time which I place in a box on my doorstep (16, Old Street), so help yourself when passing.

The Allotments

Most of these trees have been identified and are principally Suffolk or East Anglian varieties although there are a couple of mystery trees that have not yet been identified. The apple varieties include Discovery, Honey Pippin, Maxton, and Old Blake which are eaters and cookers. The best of the dessert eating apples this year has been the three Discovery apple trees which have had a lot of good-sized bright red apples.

Several of the trees, including the Discovery have been affected by the Ermine Moth which is becoming quite prevalent in Mid Suffolk generally. The moth seems to arrive in mid-Spring, just after the blossom has started to form fruiting buds and creates a large tent-like cocoon across many branches or a whole tree. Eggs are laid inside the "tent" which provides a secure environment for them to hatch. The caterpillars then feed on the leaves and fruit buds which has a direct impact on the size and number of apples leading to small and deformed fruit on affected branches or even no fruit at all. It does not seem to have a long-lasting impact and trees can recover in the following year.

The walnut trees have had a good year; one is now well-established and is a good-sized tree, about 12 feet tall that has produced a small number of edible walnuts. If you're lucky enough to be there at the right time you may get a worthwhile mouthful before the squirrels have them. The other walnut tree was badly damaged during grass cutting a few years ago and now has several stems which I am trying to gradually reduce.

Gallowsfield Wood

The fruit trees at Gallowsfield, located just inside the field at the top of the old car park, were provided by Mid Suffolk District Council and are a mix of apple and pear trees. They were planted in winter 2021 before the drought and heat-wave of summer 2022. Sadly, some of them did not get established and died after the drought (despite being watered). We hope MSDC will replace some of these trees. None of the trees have yet produced fruit that could be eaten.

St Mary's Avenue

In 2022 about 20 trees were planted by local residents and other Haughley enthusiasts in the grass area at the bottom of St Mary's Avenue amongst some existing trees, such as Cherry and Rowan. The new trees planted include apple, pear, cherry and rowan. Local support for this initiative has helped with watering the trees and spotting when attention is needed.

A few weeks ago 4 kilograms of daffodil bulbs were planted around these trees. We hope this will look wonderful in the Spring and that it will enhance the biodiversity of this part of the village. Nearby, in Fishponds Way, additional trees mainly hawthorn and rowan, but no fruit trees, have been planted alongside the hedge and path. Daffodil bulbs have been planted under some of these trees too.

WETHERDEN TOWN LANDS

Dressing the Well at The Maypole – Another Country Tradition.

It was lovely to see so many villagers at the Wetherden Town Lands May Day Fayre. The Bury Fair Women's Morris Dancers opened the fayre for us by dancing "The Blue Bells of Scotland" and they soon had many of the audience joining in with the other dances. A wonderful sight to behold and a great start to the event.

Dancing-in the Dawn on May Day is a tradition Morris Dancers up and down the country continue every year to mark the beginning of May, as it is believed to help bring about good and healthy crops. Our dancers were up at dawn that day too, despite which they put on a great display for us to open the Fayre!

Another ancient tradition that used to be practised every May Day is *Well Dressing*. It is still practised in the Derbyshire area, but it used to be done in other areas of England too. As the Maypole has a well, the Wetherden Town Lands Charity and The Maypole thought it might be nice to add to that tradition by arranging a Well Dressing here in 2024.

What is a Well dressing?

The tradition of dressing a well is believed to have been brought to England by the Romans or the Celts, to give thanks for the fresh water available from the well. Well Dressings are drawn in advance, and are then converted into hand made works of art, using natural materials such as flower petals, leaves, seeds, sand and anything natural set into a clay base, rather like a mosaic or collage. The finished dressing is placed over and around the well.

Design competition

Would you like to design The Maypole's well dressing? We would like someone local to design the picture from which we will create the dressing. Our competition is open to all ages and the winning design will be chosen by The Maypole Pub, whose decision will be final. The design needs to be circular to cover the top of the well. And the base will have a diameter of approx. 110cm, but scaled down drawings are fine as we can work these up to full size. Entries need to be received by 29th February 2024.

ORCHARD BARN NEWS



This Autumn and Winter at Orchard Barn we need to make and fit over 18,000 Sweet Chestnut wooden tiles, or shingles, for our Long House roof. That's quite a challenge that we've set ourselves, using around 600 logs which were cut locally from woods last Winter.

Sweet Chestnut doesn't grow readily in our clay soil at Orchard Barn, but thrives in the sandy soil near Foxhall, Ipswich.



The logs for our roof have been produced by coppicing, which is a traditional method of managing woodland, dating back to 4500 BC, which ensures a regular supply of timber. The trees were cut down to a stump, which encourages new growth, and have already grown back to around 2 m high, locking up 2.5 to 3 times the carbon of a standard tree. So this method is not only sustainable but environmentally friendly too. Each log should yield 30

shingles and any left-over bit will make shavings and kindling for fire lighting, and mulch for the garden, so nothing is wasted.

If you would like to be part of our project and learn traditional green woodworking craft skills, we are always happy to welcome new Volunteers. We work in a beautiful, tranquil environment surrounded by wildlife, where you will make new friends and enjoy the satisfaction of making a difference. Working parties are held 9 am – 4 pm Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays, and 10 am – 3.30 pm on Saturdays.

I am a single parent with two kids and I'm really worried about how I'll afford to pay my energy bills when I have to start putting the heating and lights on more now winter is here. At the moment I just about have enough money to cover my bills but there is nothing left over. The thought of getting into debt keeps me awake at night but the

of my children being cold and possibly unwell as a result is just unbearable. What can I do?

You are not alone - a record number of people came to Citizens Advice with energy debt in the first four months of 2023 (32,400) - a 112% increase on the same period in 2020 (15,200).

There are things you can do to feel in control when it comes to your energy bills. These tips won't cover all the extra costs, but they can make a difference:

- Check your thermostat: A room temperature between 18°C and 21°C is ideal for most people. Try turning your thermostat down by one degree within this range it could save you around £115 a year. If a medical condition means you need a warmer home, ask your GP what room temperature you should aim for.
- Keep the heat in: Check your home for any gaps in the doors, windows and floors. Blocking any holes where you could get a draught could save you around £30 a year. It is important to allow for some ventilation as without it mould and damp can form.
- Turn off anything you're not using: Turning your appliances, like TVs and washing machines, off instead of leaving them on standby could save around £60 a year. Turning off lights when you're not using them even if it's just off for a few seconds could save around £25 a year.
- Consider using LED lightbulbs, which cost less to run.
- Watch your water usage: Cutting your shower time by just one minute can make a difference. If everyone in a four-person household with a water meter did this, they could save around £75 a year.

If you're struggling to afford your energy bills, you don't have to deal with it alone. Get in touch with Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk and you can get free advice on the help available to you.


Our November talk by the UEA's Gerry Barnes gave our bumper audience a fascinating insight into "The Orchards of Eastern England", based on his co-authored book of the same name. As a former Chairman of the Forestry Commission Regional Advisory Committee for East England, he has an MBE for services to Forestry & Communities. We learnt that the eastern counties of Herts, Essex (Wilkins jams in Tiptree), Cambs (Chivers at Histon), Hunts, Beds, Norfolk (Gaymer's cider in Attleborough) and Suffolk have a tradition of fruit

cultivation comparable in scale to that of the better-known west of England. Furthermore, although orchards were planted mainly for practical reasons, they were also appreciated for their aesthetic qualities in country estates such as Suffolk's Hoxne Hall (from 1619) and Somerleyton Hall (from 1652). By the 17th century some districts (such as the Fens around Wisbech) had begun to specialise in fruit production, but it was only in the 'orchard century', 1850s-1960, that commercial production really took off, fuelled by the growth of large urban markets and the coming of the railways that could take the fruit to them with relative ease. By the 1960s, orchards were extensive in many districts but, since then, they have largely disappeared, with significant impacts on landscape character and biodiversity.



For our 14th December meeting, 7.30pm at the Wesley, we look forward to welcoming back Bryan Thurlow for his talk/ performance entitled "Music Hall Memories" - a light-hearted potted history of British Music Hall with historic songs and monologues.
