


Suffolk Historic Churches Trust Sponsored Ride & Stride 2024 Saturday 14th September, 9am to 5pm



HAUGHLEY PARISH COUNCIL PROTECTION OF THE VILLAGE GREEN

Following publication of the Council's intention to erect posts, to protect the Village Green, public feedback from residents expressing concerns led to the Parish Council suspending approval.

The Village Green still needs to be protected and this has been evident over the past year.

The following proposals are the Parish Council's intentions for protecting the Village Green;

- 1. No Parking on the corner of The Folly (outside the White House)
- 2. No parking on the odd numbered side of Old Street
- 3. No parking on the verge on the even numbers side of Old Street
- 4. Look to investigate the weight restriction for lorries
- 5. Replace the missing posts along the odd side of Old Street
- 6. Install/replace posts on the even numbered side of Old Street from the bus stop to number 46
- 7. Install/replace posts on the verge at the bus shelter
- 8. Reinstate a double height kerb from the pump to the Coal House

The Parish Council will be at the Community Café on Saturday 7th September from 10-12 to speak to residents and consultation forms will be available.

The Kings Arms was the venue for our Summer Party and it was a great success, although disappointing that the weather prevented us from holding it outside in the pub's refurbished garden. It was a lovely buffet! We also enjoyed a Lunch Club visit to the Mill at Stowmarket.

Our August meeting was about the work of EACH, the East Anglian Childrens' Hospices. Volunteer John delivered a thought-provoking

talk, highlighting that only 15% of the funding comes from government and statutory sources. There are 48 EACH charity shops in the region raising funds, stalls at events, raffles, legacies and the EACH Lottery all contribute to meet the funding shortfall. The running costs are £8500 per hospice per day

The Hospice movement began in the 1960s for adults but it was another 20 years before the first children's hospice was opened in London. EACH focuses on the whole family of those children with life- threatening conditions and 625 families are supported currently, with much of that support in their own homes and through sibling days. There are 3 hospices: The Nook in Norfolk, Milton in Cambridgeshire, and the Treehouse in Suffolk. The Treehouse is modern and purpose-built. It has a sensory room, hydrotherapy pool, and plenty of space to play and is surrounded by trees. At Christmas the trees are full of lights sponsored by BT.

All 3 hospices are rated outstanding by the Care Quality Commission.

It is our turn to run the Community Café on Saturday 7 September – be sure to visit for tea/coffee and home-made cake!

A14 COMPLETION

UNAUTHORISED ENCAMPMENT OF TRAVELLERS ON THE PLAYING FIELD

During the late evening of 29th July, a group of Travellers arrived in Haughley and formed an unauthorised encampment on King George V Playing Field. The number of caravans generally varied between 10 and 16 plus other vehicles. Haughley Parish Council, together with members of the Playing Field Committee and football clubs coordinated their efforts to minimise the extent of potential damage. The Council lead the consultations with Mid Suffolk District Council, Suffolk County Council and the Gypsy Roma and Traveller Service for Norfolk and Suffolk and the Police.

We wish to record special thanks to several people who put in many many hours:

- finding out what needed to be done within the Law,
- liaising with Council Officers and others,
- arranging for Notices to be agreed, drafted and served,
- speaking and communicating with residents and others both directly and via social media,
- preparing for and arranging for the great clean up and
- arranging for immediate and temporary security.

It was a lot more complicated that this sounds.

Within a few hours of the travellers leaving, it was necessary to secure the playing field against all access due to the site having been left with significant contamination. We thank all those who have helped, including

- ⇒ Public Realm from MSDC for cleaning up so much and so swiftly after the travellers left the premises.
- \Rightarrow Additional cleansing work proved necessary and **MJH Pressure Cleaning** came in on Sunday morning to steam clean, treat and steam rinse the children's play equipment.
- ⇒ The children's play equipment was reinspected for safety by our specialist inspector **R&S Play Installation** without charge.
- ⇒ Parkers Pitches very kindly undertook scarification of the pitches as part of this process at no charge and
- ⇒ Haughley Block Plant delivered, free of charge, concrete blocks to enhance site security to prevent further unauthorised access as a temporary measure.

Planning for a more permanent solution is in progress, including arranging finance and installing suitable barriers to enhance long term security whilst being mindful of the need for emergency vehicle access as well as maintenance and authorised vehicles.

We also thank the many people who volunteered to help with the clear up.

Whereas travellers have visited Haughley on several occasions, generally with one or two caravans at a time, they have never been known to have formed an encampment on the Playing Field during living memory – over 80 years. The unauthorised encampment on the Playing Field during recent weeks has necessitated a review of relevant risk assessments. Over the course of the next few weeks, the Playing Field Committee will consult with the Crime Prevention Officer, ambulance and fire services, officers at Mid Suffolk District Council and the Gypsy Roma and Traveller Service to identify and install appropriate security equipment.

We are grateful to the many people who have supported our efforts with understanding and offers of help.

NEWS FROM YOUR DISTRICT COUNCILLORS

Local listed building consent order: At July's Council meeting, a process was agreed to enable thousands of Grade II listed building owners to make sensitive energy efficiency upgrades more quickly and easily. The first such initiative in the country, it will involve both Mid Suffolk and Babergh working closely with Historic England, and potential upgrades will include improving or replacing windows, and permitting solar PV and other renewable technologies to be installed on unlisted outbuildings. The aim is to enable residents to more easily reduce the energy needed to power and heat their listed homes. A consultation will be undertaken in order for a policy to be progressed.

Household support: Also at July's Council meeting, the Council committed to further funding for those in need. A new discount on Council Tax for those on very low incomes and extra funds for the household support fund were approved. The fund is available to those who are finding it difficult to pay their housing costs. Any resident in need can apply via the MSDC website <u>https://www.midsuffolk.gov.uk/w/household-support-fund</u> or to phone 0300 1234000 option 3.

Call for biodiversity land summit: MSDC are holding a 'call for land' summit on 5th September, 10am-2pm, at the Mix in Stowmarket. Any landowner who would like to use their land to help wildlife – for example by tree or hedge planting or creating a meadow – is welcome to attend. This is a free event, and advice, support, and resources from local environmental organisations will be available.



WETHERDON TOWN LANDS

An Introduction

It is quite likely that people living in Wetherden have not heard of the Town Lands Trust, yet it has existed in and for the village since 1408! Here therefore is a short history of this venerable Town Trust.

We know from existing documents that the Trust started with a donation in 1408 of a plot of one acre of arable land. It is in fact the second oldest Town Charity in Suffolk, and over the years other towns introduced similar Trusts to help alleviate poverty. In those days, no formalised form of Charity existed, yet the need was there. So the Landowners stepped up to find a way to help.

Over time the Trust was granted other plots of land, with the objective of renting it out, and using the income to buy coal during the summer when it was cheap and selling it on in winter to a specifically defined group of parishioners. Some plots remain in the ownership of the Trust, some have been transferred or sold to other owners: the reasons being lost in the mists of time. A swathe of documents exists at the Hold, (Suffolk Record Office) about the land holdings including a first map dated 1690 reproduced above. It and a connected document written in the script of the time of course, shows details of each plot, location, and details of the adjacent properties, naming the owners of those lands by way of reference. Fortunately we have been able to transcribe these into understandable modern English script.

What do we represent for the Village today? The Trust is not wealthy, but we continue to this day to provide a number of contributions once a year to those we feel could be pleased and helped by these small amounts. The definition of who we may help has long since been widened from the early founding requirements of the 15th Century! In fact we are keen to learn of people who you might think deserving of a small sum around Christmas Time. The only restriction is that they must live in Wetherden, as of course many other villages and towns have similar Trusts.

The Trust owns the Allotment Lands in Park Road and Church View, and lets these out a reasonable rents for the enjoyment of Villagers. We were able a few years ago, to purchase the land used as a car park opposite the Maypole, for which we currently do not charge, and hold "Fayres" on that space twice a year again for the benefit of the villagers. We do not earn money on these events, it is just our way of creating some enjoyment to those who visit.

AN UPDATE FOR PARISHIONERS, SEPTEMBER 2024



Well done to the Haughley Parish In Bloom volunteers!

We are well into summer sunshine now following an early period of rain with no sun which had a slow growing effect on our plants. However, we are sure you will all agree that the planters have flourished and are looking very pretty, helping to enhance our village.

A huge 'Thank You' to our wonderful volunteers.

We are planning a programme replacement of some old/damaged 'worn out' planters, replacing with a few new planters during Year 2025! 

The Pavilion regeneration project – Work is ongoing behind the scenes, even though it has been slowed a little by recent events taking people's time and working around summer holidays. The revised plan focusses on extending the section of the building to the right of the front door into the area beside the Bowls green, this will be a two storey building, extending the upstairs function room and will release some space internally to fit a lift to upstairs. The shower rooms will have a reconfiguration and refit. Other parts of the building will have an upgrade to windows, external fittings such as windows, doors, guttering etc. In addition, the plan is to get away from the part oil heating/part electricity to electricity throughout, with the installation of solar panels to reduce energy costs. *If possible, the ground floor space will be increased by enclosing the patio area.*


Buy Less. Many of us purchase clothes to feel better, or to wear for one occasion. Purchasing less helps to reduce the production costs, delivery fuel etc.

HAUGHLEY PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY 16TH JULY 2024

County Councillor Andrew Stringer highlighted: The Scrutiny Committee reviewed the council's priority action plan to improve SEND services following the poor Ofsted/CQC inspection report. There was extra £4.4m funding to recruit more staff, including educational psychologists with plans to invest more money in the improvements. The DfE will review progress, including communication with parents and carers, responses to complaints and the importance of early intervention to support young children. SCC is taking part in a new initiative for fostering under the banner Foster East along with ten other councils in the region. There is an urgent need for foster carers in the East of England. The new government proposals have led to some changes on the planning system, as well as major decisions such as approval of the Sunnica Solar Farm on the Cambridge Suffolk border. This will encourage further similar projects being planned. Housing completion targets are being raised, but to date the government has not published the methodology for assessing the housing numbers required.

District Councillors Rachel Eburne & Janet Pearson submitted a report prior to the meeting. Babergh and Mid Suffolk have now published an Economic Land Needs Assessment document. This shows the future employment land requirements in the Districts to support the identified growth for 2023 to 2037, in accordance with the National Planning Policy Framework and Planning Practice Guidance. The planning application (DC/23/05721) for 29 dwellings and associated infrastructure on the land next to Millfields on Station Road was expected to be discussed at Planning Committee on 31st July. It was agreed that the Chairman would represent the Parish Council at the committee meeting.

Planning. DC/24/02825 - Erection of a single storey porch extension to Balfour House Location: Walnut Tree Manor, Haughley Green. Council SUPPORTED the application. DC/24/02869 - Application for Listed Building Consent - Remove existing external render on front gable and back elevations, repairs to timber frame as required and insulate with sheep's wool. Replace solvite board with lime putty. Paint with lime wash. Location: The Grange, Duke Street, Haughley. The Council SUPPORTED the application.

DC/24/02244 - Erection of shed (following demolition of existing). The Grain Store, Haughley New Street. Planning permission has been GRANTED.

National Grid Consultation. The Council agreed to <u>OBJECT</u> with reasons given to the consultation on the National Grid Electricity Transmission plc ("National Grid") intention to apply to the Secretary of State for a Development Consent Order ("DCO") under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 (as amended) to authorise the construction of Norwich to Tilbury.

Post Project Working Group. The Council agreed to a range of proposals for consultation and that a separate article was to be submitted to the H&W Parish News.

New MP for Waveney Valley. It was agreed to liaise with adjoining and nearby parishes (Old Newton, Stowupland and Wetherden) in the new Waveney Constituency to invite the MP to visit our area.

Lorry Survey A date and the location was agreed.

Finance. The Council received financial reports and agreed to payments, grant applications and approved various quotations.

Councillors raised various issues and agreed action where appropriate, including the condition of the grass cutting in areas of the village. Nettle encroachment for the Fishponds Way wildflower meadow which is currently managed by the developers. Plants having been stolen from planters in Fishponds Way - **Woolpit Nurseries** kindly donated replacement plants. Most of the play park items had been repaired. The grass at the moat needed to be cut. A presentation of the new plans for the regeneration of the Playing Field was made to the Councillors. It was proposed to write a PR campaign. Nettle encroaching on the play park at The Cricket.

Correspondence Councillors noted and considered correspondence.

Amidst changes to Winter Fuel Payments, Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk offers top tips on affording energy

Mid Suffolk bills this winter.

In late July the Chancellor announced changes to the Winter Fuel Payment (WFP).

The WFP is an annual one-off payment to help pensioners pay for heating during the winter. Depending on age and if you live with somebody else who's eligible, it could provide up to £300 towards your bills.

However, the new announcement means only those receiving Pension Credit or other means tested benefits will now be eligible for WFP.

The changes might be confusing and worrying to some people who have already factored WFP into their household budget.

That's why Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk is on hand to offer their top tips on affording energy bills this winter.

There are also steps those still entitled to the Winter Fuel Payment can take to make sure they don't miss out on this much-needed support. We know a third of people entitled to Pension Credit aren't claiming it, and it's more important than ever to apply for this benefit if you can.

Pension Credit is a weekly benefit to boost your income and is based on how much money you have coming in. If you have reached State Pension age, you might be able to apply for it. Check the Citizens Advice website to see if you're eligible and get instructions on how to apply.

Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk can provide in depth advice on this issue and much more, including debt, finances, employment, benefits and family/relationships. Learning from the past how to build a greener future



ELMSWELL HISTORY GROUP

Our July outing to Ely's Fenland Museum included an excellent 90-minute guided tour from the very knowledgeable Felix who took us through all the ages and different aspects of Ely's history in their beautifully refurbished and extended building. Well worth a visit and enjoyed by everyone, with the added bonus on the day of watching a number of 12-14 JULY 2024 Morris-men dancing performances all around the town, presumably from the nearby Ely Folk Festival.

We hope to have a small display at this year's ElmsFest on Sat 7th September, 12-5pm (FREE entry), at the Blackbourne Centre, so do come and see us there then, when you can perhaps take part in our local competition with the chance of winning a ticket to one of our new talks. We should be in the Chamberlayne Hall, near the bar!

FROM THE ARCHIVE, 3rd Sept 1924 - Suffolk County Library opened new premises in Northgate Street. The stained-glass windows in the upstairs room represented many aspects of Suffolk public life - literary, political, ecclesiastical and industrial. Taking pride of place was the 14th-century writer, Geoffrey Chaucer (1343-1400) who, although a Londoner, was from an Ipswich family. His greatgrandfather, Andrew Chaucer, had a hostelry on the corner of Tower and Tavern Streets, marked later by a brass plaque showing a pilgrim on horseback. Geoffrey Chaucer's father was a London vintner, but he also exported wheat from Ipswich. (*Ref: Ipswich Society*)

We look forward to welcoming you back to the Wesley Hall next month (7.30pm) for the start of our new 2024-25 season of historical talks with an East Anglian Our first one on Thurs 12th September will be "Hop Cultivation in flavour. Suffolk" by local historian, Neil Langridge. He will highlight the cultivation of hops in the Stowmarket area from 1635, particularly in Old Newton and Dagworth, brought by Flemish weavers who settled in the area.

And Finally If the weather isn't kind in the coming months and/or you're stuck indoors for any reason, why not catch up on a re-run of the BBC's 1970s series "The Story of English Furniture" on BBC4 (Freeview 9) or the iPlayer. This covers six centuries of furniture-making but also gives some fascinating details of general British history in a very relaxed and easy-going manner. So, feast your eyes on these sumptuous pieces of historic furniture and your ears on the dulcet tones of Hugh Scully and Arthur Negus - remember them?!






