

#### HAUGHLEY PARISH IN BLOOM: AUTUMN REPORT 2024



Our summer planting has been a great success, full of colour. We've had many compliments on how lovely our Parish is looking. Photos were sent to Carl, at the company Second Life Products Wales Ltd, asking permission to upload the photos to their website. Second Life Products were very impressed with how well the plants and planters complemented each other. Cathy Smith, a Suffolk Wildlife Trust Community Wildlife Conservation adviser, visited Haughley during the summer months and complimented the way we had incorporated pollinators into the planters.

Planters have all recently been planted up, ready for Spring 2025. Thanks to all the volunteers for their ongoing support. We couldn't do it without you all. Alison and Yvonne (and our 'volunteer' husbands) spent four hours planting pansies and bulbs, including pollinators, in all of the Parish planters. Also, a thousand Daffodil bulbs were planted between the planters, along both sides of the length of Old Street, and planters were filled with fresh compost.

Haughley New Street has also been planted with Daffodils on the verges, starting at each end of the hamlet. Thank you to the HNS working party, who have worked very hard to keep our hamlet looking tidy. We are looking for volunteers in Haughley Green, to set up a similar working group, to help with planting and to maintain a standard that we all can be proud of.

Some of our volunteers have decided that summer watering has become too much for them and have decided that they would like to step away. We would like to thank them all for their great efforts, time and support.

Haughley Parish in Bloom has completed a CIL application to Haughley Parish Council for approval to buy two new planters for the Moat and Triangle green, at the junction of Duke Street, near to the duck pond/Plashwood Road. If the CIL application is approved, the planters will be delivered, put into place and planted with the spring bulbs and pansies.

If you (or you know of anyone else) would like to help us to keep the Parish bright, cheerful and welcoming for us all, please contact either Alison or Yvonne. We are looking for volunteers, for summer 2025. Any support would be most welcome and we will assist you as much as you feel necessary.

We are looking at how the planters can be kept neat and tidy, especially at the base. We are hoping that, in 2025, we can get the bases strimmed from May to October, We will keep you updated.

**Preparing for winter** – On Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> October we tidied up the car park as part of the village litter pick and went on to mow under the hedges as well as prune and strim near the entrance to improve visibility when leaving the car park. We will also be putting up a replacement sign further forward listing the clubs, so it is easier for visitors to know they have found the right venue. Thank you to the volunteer helpers.

**Fond Farewell** – Claire Pizzey our Parish Clerk is moving on to pastures new. We thank her for all she has done to support the Playing Field Committee, particularly with the recent incursion at the field during the summer. She was such a tremendous help and learned a lot that that knowledge will be shared with other councils in her new role at SALC (Suffolk Association for Local Councils). We will still be able to pick her brains for advice. Claire has promised to join us at the **Christmas lights switch on** and help us serve mulled wine and mini mince pies again this year. See you there.

The Pavilion regeneration project – We have been successful in securing a grant from the Parish Council CIL fund of £100,000. This will help us seek further grants, also enabling us to get professional support for technical drawings. We have subsequently met potential companies for quotes and approached the National Lotteries community partnership fund to establish whether our project meets their criteria and advice on applying to them.

**New Security** – We are seeking quotes for installation of anti-ram telescopic bollards following our meeting on 1<sup>st</sup> October where all agreed this would be the preferred option.

Our October speaker, Margo Harrison, has been a volunteer for Hearing Dogs for Deaf People for the past INSPIRING WOMEN 15 years. She was accompanied by Linus, her hearing dog for the last 5 years. Linus - a Blue Roan Cocker



Spaniel - was impeccably behaved and much admired by all of his audience!

Margo became an accomplished lip reader as she lost her hearing only gradually during her adult years. She realised that the usual sounds of work were becoming more muted and things finally came to a head when one day she failed to hear her workplace fire alarm. Unable to use hearing aids she then turned to Hearing Dogs and was offered the services of a trained hearing dog. Linus now supports her both in her home and in work, as he has been trained to alert her to a range of important and life saving sounds such as her alarm clock and other timers, the doorbell and all types of smoke/fire alarms. When out and about with Margo he wears a distinctive burgundy coat which helps to identify his role.

As a reliable breed, Linus started his 18 month training as a puppy and was then carefully matched with Margo. He will remain with her as a working dog until he is approx 12 years old.

One in five of us have a detected hearing loss. Profound deafness is a particularly isolating disability and hearing dogs can help people of all ages to reconnect with life and regain their confidence. The cost of training and supporting a hearing dog throughout their lifetime is now £40,000 and Hearing Dogs relies on fund raising and donations as there is no government support.

This was a most enjoyable talk and it was a privilege to witness the delightful relationship between Margo and Linus.

#### ARMISTICE DAY SILENCE & SIREN

As is tradition on Armistice Day, Monday 11th November 2024, Haughley will pause at 11 o'clock to remember all those who have fallen in Armed Conflict. The Parish Air Raid Siren will sound at 10.59 to indicate the approaching hour followed by the striking of the Church Clock at 11am. The Siren will then sound again at 11-02 to indicate the end of the Two Minutes. A short Service of Remembrance will be held on the Village Green following the Two Minutes Silence.

#### THE HAUGHLEY SOLDIER SILHOUETTES

The Haughley Soldier Silhouettes designed and installed by Kieron Palmer in 2019, will return to Haughley Village Green for the Season of Remembrance from the end of October to mid-November. Each Silhouette represents one of the 'Forty One Men of Haughley' whom left the village in the two World Wars to fight for our freedom and never returned. The Display of the Fallen will be in the window of Palmers Bakery. The Poppy Muffins & Biscuits will once again be on sale at Palmers Bakery in aid of the Royal British Legion.

#### MICHAEL TIPPETT

#### **ILLUSTRIOUS SON OF WETHERDEN**

On the 21st September we hosted an evening of music and verse including guitar works by Michael Tippett, who became one of the best known English Composer of the 20th Century. Our guitarist Declan Hickey had recently heard that Tippett was born here, from his own local connections to the area. Because of that, he wanted people from around here to have a chance to know more about Tippett and his musical career. I offered a short introduction about his connections to Wetherden, which might be of interest to those who could not come to the concert, and I publish it here.

Michael Tippett was born to Henry and Isabel Tippett in a nursing home in Pimlico, London on January 2nd 1905.

The family actually lived in Eastcote in Middlesex and that was where they were until 1907. However in 1905 the Tippetts purchased a home in Wetherden. It was called St Briavels, but Henry took against the house being named after a Christian Saint so he changed its name to Rosemary Cottage. An extension was being built during 1905/6 and in 1907 the family moved in.

Michael's mother Isabel was from a family much involved in the Suffragists the non-violent arm of the Suffragette movement. It is relevant to mention this as at the age of just eight Michael spoke his first words in public making a speech, questioning why women were not allowed to vote, when they were every bit the equal of men! Of course he was still living here at the time.

Michael as the child of a well to do family enjoyed the peace and quiet of this small Suffolk village, like most of us do today. He and his older brother Peter could play in the street outside their home, which children certainly cannot do today!

In fact as Henry had the only car in the village a de Dion Bouton, which regularly broke down, traffic was not a big issue

Michael went to church with his Mother and Peter, sitting in the in the chancel to the end of the south side choir pew, but they would not have gone often. Michael apparently liked the singing of hymns. The boys were tutored at home and that included Michael's first attempts at learning the piano, so this is where the first stirrings of his affinity to music appeared. He later said he, to quote "took to improvising crazily – which I called composing though I only had the vaguest idea of what that meant!"

Later during the latter years at Wetherden Michael and Peter went to boarding schools and eventually in 1920 the house here was sold and his parents moved abroad to a hotel they hotel owned in France. So the boys then saw little of their parents, only during school holidays.

Michael, spent only around 13 years in Wetherden but we can take pleasure at knowing that his interest in music began here.

We know that he came back to visit Wetherden in 1974, accompanied by two people writing books about him. Possibly that was the only time he came back after the house was sold. He is quoted as having been very moved. Possibly at the poor state of the outbuildings which he had enjoyed playing around as a child.

Briavel House as it is now known, is on the Stowmarket Road just a short walk eastward from the village centre. The frontage still bears a round plaque, depicting Peter Paul Rubens placed there by Henry Tippett, who was an admirer of the painter. Poor St Briavel an obscure hermit from centuries ago, has returned to his titular place, on a House name plate at the entrance!

The only other object marking the Tippetts' life in Wetherden is a grave in the shape of a cross in Wetherden Churchyard. It remembers Mary Molly Tippett, Michael's cousin who came here on a visit with her mother, sadly suffered a cerebral haemorrhage at the house and died on March 5th 1918.

Michael Tippett died in 1998 at the age of 93. He had a colourful life, and was well known in music worlds. He was admired in his field and was honoured in several ways:

He was knighted in 1966, made Commander of the Order of the British Empire in 1959, became a Companion of Honour in 1979 and was awarded the Order of Merit in 1983.

So whilst a rather short part of his life was here, Wetherden can take pride that we have such a close connection to this 20th Century English composer, an illustrious son of Wetherden.

## HAUGHLEY PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD 15<sup>th</sup> October 2024 at the Ron Crascall Pavilion

<u>Public Forum</u> – There were no concerns raised in the public forum

<u>Actions</u> – Updates have been requested re: The junior football pitch/
upgrades to footpaths/Haughley Green footpaths/Village Green kerbs & posts/
meeting with new MP. Information, statements and evidence are being collated regarding Horse safety signs for Haughley Green. A maintenance plan was agreed for the regular mowing of the moat green.

<u>County Councillor Andrew Stringer</u> – Reports the council is preparing for the new recycling and waste collection requirements set out in the Environment Act 2021/Councils financial forecast for 24-25/Closure of warm homes Suffolk scheme with disappointing uptake, will provide further information on future schemes to residents/ The withdrawal of the devolution deal which had been tabled for Suffolk following the change in government.

<u>District Councillors Rachel Eburne & Janet Pearson</u> – Reports MSDC jointly with Babergh, is hosting a Rural Housing Event on Wednesday, 6th November 2024 (details on request)/ A new transport service "The Mid Suffolk Taxi Bus" – will be launched at the end of this month delivered by Swift Cabs – more information at the launch event Tuesday 29th October from 1pm to 6pm at the John Peel Centre in Stowmarket.

<u>Planning</u> – Councillors reviewed and agreed responses to the following planning applications:

- DC/24/03992 One Acre, Haughley New Street, Haughley, Stowmarket Suffolk IP14 3JN. - The Parish Council SUPPORTS the application
- DC/24/03993 One Acre, Haughley New Street, Haughley, Stowmarket Suffolk IP14 3JN. The Parish Council SUPPORTS the application
- **DC/24/04298** Castle Barn, Duke Street, Haughley, Stowmarket Suffolk IP14 3QS. The Parish Council SUPPORTS the application.
- **DC/24/04260** 28 Old Street, Haughley, Stowmarket, Suffolk IP14 3NX. The Parish Council SUPPORTS the application.
- **DC/24/04323** Old Bells Yard, Wassicks Lane, Haughley, IP14 3NP. The Parish Council OBJECTS to the application. (The Parish Council does not believe that the application is class Q; The building is not currently being used for agricultural purposes)
- **DC/24/04332** Dulce Donum, 67 Old Street, Haughley, Stowmarket Suffolk IP14 3NT. The Parish Council SUPPORTS the application.
- DC/23/05721 Land on the North Side of Station Road: the Parish Council

  responsibility for the offsite public open space improvements in the parish once
  agreed by MSDC

<u>Gallowsfield Wood - Councillors considered the offer made to the Parish Council in relation to the potential sale of Gallowsfield Wood. The Parish Council rejected the offer to sell. But will offer the hire of parts of the wood under T&Cs yet to be considered.</u>

<u>Haughley Parish in Bloom</u> – Councillors agree quotes to be taken for the strimming of the planters between May/Oct. CIL application for two new planters accepted. The grit bin at Harvest close will be relocated.

<u>Traffic Officer</u> - Councillors noted that the post on Fishponds Way is suitable for the installation of a Solar SiD device. It was agreed to upgrade the post in Haughley Green to accommodate a Solar SiD device. The location of the Solar SiDs throughout the Parish were noted. It was agreed that the Parish Council purchases a further Solar SiD so all Haughley's SiD devices are Solar.

<u>Traffic Count</u> - Councillors noted the results of the traffic count undertaken in June 2024, and the results of the lorry count undertaken on Station Road in September 2024 and it was agreed that the results are shared with Suffolk County Council with a request that they contact the operators of the respective vehicles that are suspected to be classified as over 7½ tonnes and using Station Road other than for access property with access off Station Road. All results will be sent to the County Councillor and will be available on the Parish website and in the Parish Magazine.

<u>Allotments</u> – The Parish Council agreed a 20% increase in the rental price per year for 3 years. Mrs S Swinge, will take the position of Allotment Officer





#### TRAFFIC REPORTS


The automated vehicle counts undertaken during the summer provides a lot of data, from include the two graphs reproduced here.



#### Graph 1

This graph indicates the numbers of vehicles passing through the count areas as an Annual Average Daily Traffic (AADT) with standard road type classification. Whereas most of the counts have remained reasonably consistent, the rise in top line representing traffic through Haughley New Street with it's tailing off towards the end corresponds to the improvement works on the A14. The second line from the top relates to Stowmarket Road, Wetherden with a broadly comparable pattern.

**Graph 2** represents the percentage of commercial vehicles against the standard road types. Two roads in the count are particularly striking. The line at the top of the graph represents Station Road with a very substantial growth in percentage of commercial vehicles over all vehicles using Station Road. The second line from the top represents the percentage of commercial vehicles over all vehicles passing through Haughley New Street. Graph 1 indicates that the overall traffic numbers have reduced following completion of the A14 road works, but that the percentage of commercial vehicles over all vehicles (graph 2) has increased. This suggests that the number of commercial vehicles has not reduced in the same ratio as other vehicles since completion of the A14 roadworks.

**Station Road lorry watch.** First, thank you to all those who supported this count, including Parish Councillors and residents.

Based on the assumptions made, over half of the HGVs had legitimate reason to use Station Road, given that the only access to these respective companies is off Station Road.

#### **DISTRICT COUNCILLORS' REPORT - OCTOBER 2024**

#### **Council Homes**

MSDC has joined with over 100 other councils to urge the government to take action to reform the currently broken council housing system. The five point plan put forward is:-

- 1. A new fair and sustainable Housing model including an urgent one-off rescue cash injection, and long-term, certain rent and debt agreements.
- 2. Reforms to unsustainable Right to Buy policies
- 3. Removing red tape on existing funding
- 4. A new, long-term, Green & Decent Homes Programme
- 5. Urgent action to restart stalled building projects, avoiding the loss of construction sector capacity and a market downturn.

A motion was passed at the September Council meeting resolving to write to the Secretary of State urging this action, to continue to publicise the problem and to encourage Housing Associations to work closely with the Council.

#### ELMSWELL HISTORY GROUP

Barbara McElroy's Oct talk on *Framlingham* gave us some fascinating facts and figures of the castle's 1,000-year history and the effect that had on the town itself. The first of three castles was Anglo-Saxon and was where King Edmund took refuge from the Danes before he came to his sad end in Hoxne. Some time later, the first of the *six*(!) Barons Roger Bigod built a wooden more substantial castle and took on its stewardship. In Nov 1120, the French vessel "White Ship" (carrying the heir to the English throne with many nobles) sank in The Channel returning from France and, as there was only one survivor (a butcher from Rouen), there remained no heirs to the

throne which further led to many barons vying for power. Thereafter, the castle changed ownership many times between the Crown and various Lords/Nobles.

Henry II took the castle from Bigod in 1137, knocked down most of the Anglo-Saxon town to build a stone castle and the 600-acre Framlingham Great Park of oak trees for hunting. One notable very wealthy owner of the castle, and grand-daughter of Edward I, was Lady Margaret Brotherton (1320-1399) who inherited it in 1382 on the death of her second husband, and she made extensive improvements. Thomas Howard, uncle of two of Henry VIII's wives, Anne Boleyn and Catherine Howard, later to become the first Duke of Norfolk, was given the castle by the King. After the death of the third Duke of Norfolk who never lived in Framlingham, the castle returned to the Crown, and Mary Tudor

was proclaimed Queen there when she fled to the castle with about 35,000 followers (at a time when the town's population was in the mere hundreds!). Queen Elizabeth I used the castle as a prison in 1600. Sir Robert Hitcham purchased the castle in 1635 for £14,000 (several millions today), established almshouses within the grounds, and left a fairly complicated will which left most of his monies to Cambridge's Pembroke College (which still owns much of Framlingham today) with a stipulation to educate the children of the town, eventually resulting in three local schools being established in 1654. For many years, the castle was allowed to deteriorate until, in 1913, it was taken over by the Ministry of Public Works and used in WW1 for military training (Lord Kitchener lived nearby), subsequently the Royal Engineers and Home Guard were stationed there in WW2. The current custodians, English Heritage, have made many improvements, including a superb local museum and café within the castle grounds. Perhaps the most famous current resident of Framlingham is the singer Ed Sheeran.

Whenever I read this Bible story I think of my granddaughter, Paige, who had been brought up in the USA on a large estate where her parents worked and had fostered Afro-American children.

Following her marriage and having lived in the hassle and bustle of central London, she moved with her husband and family to South Africa. A complete change of lifestyle which allowed her to bring up her two children in a leafy suburb of Constantia, just outside Cape Town, in the sunshine and with a garden.

One day while out she noticed a lady asking for help so that she could support her family, and The Giving Bag was born, a non-profit organisation on a mission to provide gift bags of hope to needy women and children in Cape Town. The concept for the Giving Bag took root when she was decluttering her home and clearing out baby clothes her children had outgrown. "Paige thought instead of donating it somewhere why not just give it away myself," she says. "I started by putting clothing and toiletries in some reusable bags and backpacks and handing them out to women and children on the streets and then it has just flourished from there." The gift bags include clothing, shoes, toiletries, soaps, toothpaste, toothbrushes, hand sanitiser, shampoos, body washes and small tokens of kindness such as stuffed toys, puzzles, books etc. Her kindness was recognized by the Union of Jewish Women, a non-profit organisation with more than 90 years of experience providing welfare projects across South Africa, and they took the Giving Bag under its wing and gave it the status of a registered non-profit organisation and public benefit organisation.

A small act of kindness which grew to cover a nation. John Webb.

Our long term project to reinstate the 1580s Long House as our new



Everywhere I look I see adverts for upcoming sales Black Friday and Cyber Monday 'deals' are jumping
out at me from all directions. Some of the prices seem
too good to be true - how can I be sure I really am
getting a good deal and not being scammed?

You're not the only one eager to bag a bargain. The busiest shopping time of the year is also a busy time for cyber criminals who use the spike in spending to disguise their scams as legitimate shopping sites.

Fraudsters are also taking advantage of Al advances to help them produce accurate and professional-looking content to trick victims into giving away their financial details.

It sounds like you're aware there are risks when buying online and that scammers will try to tempt consumers with special offers, fake reviews and sought-after items at rock bottom prices. The good news is there are ways you can protect yourself and shop safely.

Here are five tips to make sure you don't end up with more, or less, than you bargained for during this busy shopping season.

- Make sure you don't feel rushed. Scammers will often create a sense of urgency by claiming it's a limited offer or price which encourages you to act without taking as much time to consider the purchase.
- Know who you are buying from if buying from a company you have not used before, check reviews and previous customers' feedback. If in doubt, don't buy.
- Be wary of suspicious web links. These may direct you to fake (but realistic looking) websites. It is better to type in the website address yourself.
- Don't share any one-time codes that you're sent when shopping online. These
  codes are used to confirm that you're the one making the purchase, so don't
  share them with anyone.
- Avoid paying anyone you don't know by bank transfer. Paying by credit card
  for single items costing £100 and over gives you legal protection if the goods
  do not arrive, are faulty, or do not match the description. Paying by credit or
  with debit card for orders costing less than £100 also gives you protection
  using your card provider's voluntary 'Chargeback' scheme.




