



#### HAUGHLEY PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council held a meeting on Monday 15 July 2025. The Council co-opted Mark Lloyd as a new Parish Councillor and welcomed him to the meeting.

The Council noted and reviewed the updated Action Log. C Cllr Andrew Stringer had submitted a written report which included reference to a new Devolution Office to assist with the planning and execution of Suffolk's Devolution. If more than one Unitary Authority is formed, this would involve a disaggregation of some County Council services. Parliament will make a decision on the final plan for devolution in the coming weeks. The County Council's flood team recently won a local Government award for excellence for being proactive in their management of flood plan areas. Aggmax quarry – part of the road has been cleaned recently by the County Council. The drains have not be maintained and there has been damage to the road surface. The quarry's application had stalled due to a lack of engagement from the applicant. District Councillor Janet Pearson summarised the MSDC July Report. Stowmarket's Food Museum has successfully been granted one million pounds in grant funding from the District Council. These funds along with National Lottery funding will fund an expansion of the site. The County Council recently voted down a motion to allow Parishes to request 20mph speed limits.

Planning Applications - DC/25/03090 Stansfield House Wetherden Road Haughley – Discharge of conditions – NOTED. DC/25/03021 Land on the North Side of Station Road Haughley – Discharge of conditions – NOTED. HPC due to receive additional funding for new play/exercise equipment. DC/25/02252 - The White House, The Green, Haughley to re-instate an original sized window in the gable end (Listed Building application) APPROVED.

Neighbouring Parishes Liaison Meeting - The July meeting was well attended. The draft notes from the July meeting were circulated to Councillors for note. The unauthorised encampment in Stowupland had dispersed. Some improvement works have been undertaken to the proposed junior football pitch - further concerns remain. The Council discussed the proposal to transfer ownership of the land with the Footpath between Castle Rise to the Playing Field.

The Council received a verbal update on activities of Pavillion Regeneration Working Group, including discussion with Mid Suffolk District Councillors; careful consideration required when deciding which grants to apply for to prevent any conflicting grant application rules; to seek pre-planning application advice from the Districts Planning department; benefits of long term tenures to support most of the grants applications and a Green energy plan should be drawn up.

A range of VJ Day 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary events were being organised. The Council received an update on the proposed Christmas Fair. Nominated Councillors agreed to progress management of the Allotments. It was agreed to purchase and install an additional dog poo bin to adjoin Station Road opposite the new housing development. The current Pride in Your Place funding was nearing closure and had been successful. The Council considered finance and approved the proposed expenditure.

Councillors raised various issues, including one or more dogs had been off-lead in the fenced children play area on the Playing Field – this is intended to be a dog-free area. Signage to this effect had been unofficially removed on several occasions. Signs to various footpaths need to be replaced.

Councillors noted correspondence received.

The next scheduled meeting is due to be held Tuesday 16 September at the Pavilion at 7pm.

#### **ELMSWELL HISTORY GROUP**

Our July outing was to Hawstead's Great War Huts, the impressive First World War Heritage Project, which we visited with Woolpit History Group (see photo). The evening's visit was led by local renowned expert WW1 historian, Taff Gillingham, who gave us an enthusiastic and comprehensive explanation of how this project came to be. Following the discovery of an original WW1 Recreation Hut, which was due to be demolished, the project started to find other original buildings across the country that were constructed over a century ago to house the men and women who served during the war. Many of these huts have been dismantled, restored (with as many of the original materials as possible), and reerected on site to provide a fitting environment for displays and exhibits. This site provides a unique setting in which to learn about the personal, military and social history of the conflict and much more. They offer site tours, March to November, on the fourth Wednesday of the month, which can be booked via their website. This unique venue also holds a wide variety of events throughout the year, including their popular 'Hutted Histories' talks, exhibitions, film screenings, live performances and tours. As well as children's activities over the summer holidays, they also provide organised and customised school visits throughout the year. series of trenches have been built using the original trench building manuals of the time for reference, so the size, depth and materials are all accurate for those built in France and Flanders all those years ago. There are dugouts, latrines, observation posts, fire steps, and a Regimental Aid Post, with the probable yearly highlight being their 'Trenches by Twilight' event each December which tells the story of the 1914 Christmas Truce. We concluded with welcome refreshments after what was a revelatory experience for us all. FROM THE ARCHIVE, 18<sup>th</sup> Sept 2011: A replica WW1 battlefield, painstakingly created at Rise Hall Farm in Akenham near Ipswich, was seen across the country in the ITV drama *Downton Abbey,* featuring Matthew Crawley, heir to the family fortune, dodging muck and bullets at the Battle of Somme. Historian Taff Gillingham, who spent thousands of pounds building trenches identical to those used by British and German troops in WW1, said that, "when filming takes place, there's a huge amount of local industry that benefit from it, with up to 100 local extras". (EADT, 2011)

We start our new 2025-6 season of talks on Thursday **11**<sup>th</sup> **September**, 7.30pm in Elmswell's Wesley Hall (School Rd, IP30 9EE), when our annual subs of £12 (plus £4 per attendance) will be due for payment. That evening's speaker, Zoe Adlam, will give us her fascinating talk "Fool's Gold – should the Law of Treasure be Changed to Improve Protection of Portable Antiquities?". Do join us then and, if you do not wish to become a member, just £6 is payable as a Visitor.

#### FINNINGHAM LPG COMMUNITY BUYING GROUP UPDATE


Further to my recent open letter in the village newsletters, inviting interested households to join the group, I thought it would be of interest to give an update.

#### Dear Friends,

And so to Keats' 'season of mists and mellow fruitfulness.' The meteorological autumn starts on 1 September although we will have to wait until around 21 September for the autumnal equinox when the days are of equal length. We look back to the lazy hazy (extremely hot) days of Summer, to the stress of exam results and to happy times spent on holiday. Our thoughts turn to what is in store – a new school, a new job, a new home perhaps. The strange feelings of 'empty nesters' as children leave home for further education, training or employment in another part of the country or further afield.

In September we are now well into the period of what the church calls Ordinary Time which is the part of the Church's year which falls outside major festival seasons and now lasts to the end of the year. It's a time which we use for reflecting on Jesus' ministry and focuses on the mystery of Christ in its fullness, allowing for a deeper engagement with the Gospel readings and themes throughout the year. it's a time to reflect on how to live out one's faith in daily life and to explore various themes related to Christian living, including creation and the environment.

We will be beginning the run up to Christmas (which, of course, will come all too quickly). Soon we will be preparing for our harvest festivals which will be celebrated in our churches in September and the beginning of October. Our All Souls' Memorial Service and Remembrance Sunday services will follow rapidly and then a new church year will start at the beginning of December

Our lives will be full of busyness and we need to take time to rest and relax and perhaps reset out relationship with God and his church. It may be that you used to pray, or read the Bible or go to Church. You may have got out of the habit, you may be embarrassed about coming back to church but I would encourage you to give it a try - you may find that it fills what you are missing in your life. There is a Celtic invitation (slightly adapted) which sums this up:

This is the Church of the Lord. It is ready for those who love him and who want to love him more. So come, You who have much faith and you who have little, You who have been here often and you who have not been for a long time. You who have tried to follow and you who have failed. Come, it is our Lord's will that those who want him should meet him here.

As churches we are looking forward to the announcement and arrival of our new Rector. For me, this will be a time of mixed feelings — I will be taking the opportunity to step back from more active ministry for a while but I shall miss the people that I have come to know during the two periods that I have been able to minister among you.

#### **Understanding Your Payslip**



a guide for those returning to work

If you've recently returned to work after some time away, you might find your payslip a bit confusing. You're not alone – it can take a little time to get used to the different sections and terms.

By law, employers must give you a payslip (on paper or online) showing what you've been paid and what's been deducted. It's a good idea to keep your payslips for up to six years, just in case you need them later.

Your payslip should include your employer's details, your name, and possibly an employee number. You'll also see a **payment date** (when your pay reaches your bank) and a **tax period**. The UK tax year starts in April, so tax period 01 is April, 02 is May, and so on.

You'll also see your **National Insurance (NI) number** – this is your personal number used to record your NI contributions, which help you qualify for state benefits like the pension.

Next is your **tax code**, set by HMRC. This usually includes numbers and a letter. The numbers show how much of your income is tax-free; the letter reflects your situation. You can check what your tax code means at https://www.gov.uk/tax-codes/what-your-tax-code-means. If you're on an 'emergency' code (ending in W1, M1 or X), you might be paying too much tax, so it's worth checking.

Your **gross pay** is what you earn before anything is taken off. This might include your basic pay plus extras like travel allowance. If you're paid by the hour, the rate and hours worked should be shown. If holiday pay is included with your wages, it should be listed separately.

**Deductions** may include tax, National Insurance, pension, or student loan payments. These are added up, and what's left is your **net pay** – the amount that goes into your bank.

You might also see **taxable pay**, showing how much of your income has been taxed so far this year.

If anything doesn't seem right, it's best to speak to your employer.
