THE HAUGHLEY PARK PROJECT

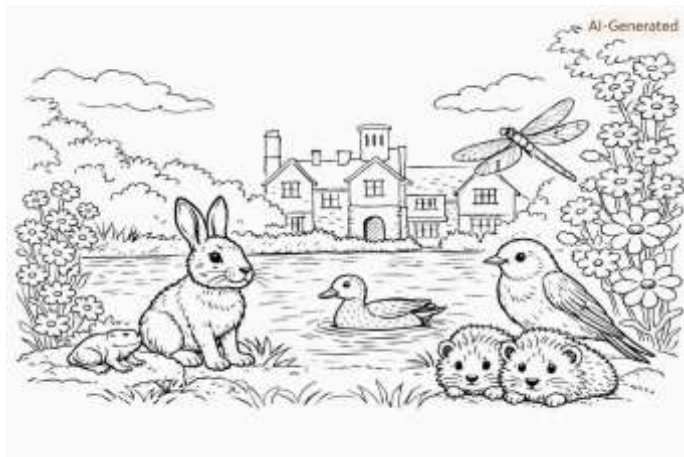
Come and listen to Arthur Williams explain a Project to restructure the grounds of Haughley Park around Nature, Wellness and Art: each aspect generating its own programme and overlapping to create hybrid experiences.

It is intended that intersectional experiences would encompass nature healing, art therapy and environmental art. The aim is to bring in rewilding initiatives aligned with the national biodiversity policy, as well as bringing back native Suffolk flora and fauna in line with the wildlife policy of the County and incorporate an opportunity to showcase traditional Suffolk trades.

This is a very exciting venture that could bring work to the area. It is also an opportunity for you to share your thoughts and highlight any concerns that you may have.

The talk is at Wetherden Church, on the 17th September, commencing at 1930hrs

The cost of **£5** includes wine and food after the talk, when you will be able to discuss aspects of the Project in more detail, should you wish. Tickets are available through dreamscapeip@protonmail.com.

Our meeting last month was a brilliant talk on visiting the amazing country of China!



Keith Norman from Wendy Wu Tours (the UK's Number One China Tour Operator – who have over 25 years' experience) came along with a slide show presentation to give us a pictorial tour of China's highlights.

We started in Beijing, China's capital city and home to the Forbidden City, the Temple of Heaven and Tiananmen Square, and a gate way to the Great Wall of China (which you can't see from Space despite the myth!) and then on to the Xian – the origin of the Silk Road and home to the Terra Cotta Warriors. Here there are over 8,000 life sized clay sculptures. And amazingly no two statues have the same face!



One of the highlights of Keith's talk was when he told us all about visiting the Giant Panda breeding centre in Chengdu. This world-famous conservation centre is home to over 80 Giant Pandas, and this adorable creature is the national symbol of China and universally loved by all.

Keith continued with a trip to the modern city of Chongqing, where amazingly a modern train line runs right through the middle of a block of flats and has become a bit of an unlikely tourist attraction!

We then headed to the most amazing scenic city of Zhangjiajie in China's northwest Hunan province which is famous for the Zhangjiajie National Forest Park. Here you will find the Hallelujah Mountains with over a 1000 dramatic, mist shrouded limestone pillars, which featured in the film 'Avatar'. The Grand Canyon Glass Bridge was opened in 2016 and is the world's highest and longest glass bridge ever constructed!

After a quick trip down the Yangtze River in a sampan, we headed by a Maglev train (the world's first commercial high-speed magnetic levitation train) to Shanghai – China's biggest city and a global financial hub. Here China and the Western world collide in an explosion of gleaming skyscrapers!!



Keith finished his talk with a quiz – and asked us to guess the length of The Great Wall of China! The answer was an outstanding 13,000 miles!! Totally unbelievable!!

DISTRICT COUNCILLORS' REPORT - JULY 2026

Local Government Reform

The government has decided that there will be 3 unitary authorities in Suffolk. The now Reform led Suffolk County Council are pursuing a legal challenge to this. Work continues as MSDC to enable the detailed work on reorganisation to take place. The 3 new unitary councils have provisionally been called Central and East Suffolk, Ipswich and South Suffolk and West Suffolk. A new website developed by all the Suffolk councils detailing the proposed boundaries, names and warding with an interactive map has been developed. Home - Future Suffolk Residents can ask questions through the website and make comments. Timetable at present: Elections to the new 'shadow' unitary authorities will take place in May 2027. The unitary councils will take over formal responsibilities on vesting day April 1st 2028. Until then, the existing County and District Councils will continue to deliver services as normal.

Locality Awards

The next round of grants has begun this year for funding for community organisations to apply. Locality Awards - Mid Suffolk District Council - babergh.gov.uk / midsuffolk.gov.uk

Pride in your Place Grants applications are now open. These grants are available for capital projects that enable community groups to enhance their local area and environment, explore local identity and heritage, and engage in activities such as community clean ups

Better Recycling

We have now reached the end of Week 6 of Better Recycling and completed two full collection cycles under the new service arrangements. The service has now moved from implementation into normal operational management. Food scheme participation rate and yield seem positive (initial estimates around 50-60%).

Stowmarket Innovation Gateway

Mid Suffolk District Council's Stowmarket Innovation Gateway is a collaboration between Freeport East and MSDC and officially opened on July 14th. It offers office spaces for high growth start-ups, collaboration and innovation areas, meeting rooms, a café and high-quality training spaces. This centre was designed with growing sectors such as the green economy and digital/AI technology in mind. The project has also been delivered in partnership with Universities of Suffolk and Essex, West Suffolk College, Suffolk New College and Colchester Institute who will be delivering a programme of professional development courses to address the region's skills gap.

Summarised minutes of the Parish Council Meeting
held on 20th July 2026

Attendance & Administration

- Apologies accepted from four councillors.
- No declarations of interest.
- Minutes from the May 2026 Annual Parish Council meeting were approved.

District & County Reports

District Council

- Suffolk County Council (now Reform-led) is challenging the previously agreed plan for three unitary councils.
- Better Recycling project has moved into normal operations.
- Joint Local Plan consultation is open.
- Stowmarket Innovation Gateway officially opened.
- “Pride in Your Place” grants now available for community environmental and heritage projects.

County Council

- Post-16 Travel Policy approved for 2026–27.
- £3m invested in 11 new fire engines.
- County Council pursuing legal action over Local Government Reform (cost up to £500k).
- £18k approved to remodel councillors’ office space.
- Highways visited ad hoc laybys on former A14; plastic bollards suggested as a Low-cost solution.
- Concerns raised about HGV turning issues linked to Lawn Farm development Wetherden PC should not bear signage costs.
- New SID post location on Stowmarket Road agreed.
- Drainage issues at Rectory Hill partly resolved; remaining blocked drains re-reported.

Finance

- Bank balance (13 July 2026): **£17,255.62**.
- Routine payments approved, including salaries, landscape work, litter picking, HMRC, and playground equipment.
- Income received from Locality Budget (£1,500), refund (£232.50), and Wetherden Charities (£1,000).

Projects & Updates

Playground Swing

- Deposit paid; delivery expected late summer.
- Thanks recorded to funders.
- Bramble and branch clearance to be scheduled.

Village Sign

- Old sign removed; new carved oak sign maker identified.
- Grants and quotations being pursued.
- Some residents suggest relocating the sign to the village centre near the bus stop.

Speed Indicator Device (SID)

- Quote received for solar□powered replacement.
- June–July traffic data shows:
 - **Incoming:** 80.86% at 30mph or below.
 - **Outgoing:** 64.25% at 30mph or below.

Data to be retained as evidence for Highways/Police.

Common & Playing Fields

- Request received to plant a memorial tree.
- Proposal for outdoor church services on the Common—Cllr Perry to progress.

Public Participation

- Football club has treated and seeded the playing field.
- Townlands Trust to be contacted about placing a “Protecting Your Open Spaces” banner.
- Rubbish dumped in ditch near the bridge.
- Small SID to be moved to village centre but must be removed when ANPR device is installed.

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HAUGHLEY PARISH COUNCIL

The Council held a meeting on 21 July 2026. Nilam Vora was coopted as a Parish Councillor and welcomed to the meeting.

Although not a Parish Council event, the Chairman thanked all who were involved with the **Open Gardens Day**. Progress is being made with a parish consultation following the MSDC Call for Sites. The Council received a **notification for tree works** at The Elms, The Folly (DC/26/03025) and supported the application.

There was to be an **Open Day at the Playing Fields** the following Saturday. It was suspected that there was **inappropriate drug use** at the playing field and that there is an online reporting tool to report suspected activity of this nature. Alternative arrangements are being made for formal play equipment inspections.

Considerable work has been undertaken at **Gallowsfield Wood**, including grass cutting, repairs to several bench seats and a forest school visit with residents from a care home. Despite a large notice banning fires, there had been an **unauthorised fire** in the fire pit area which was left in a hazardous state. Fires, especially during a drought, are extremely dangerous. The Council agreed to the working group's proposal to apply for grant funding under the Rural Payment Scheme.

The Council received an update from **the Allotments**, including that advice about the hose pipe ban had been shared with allotment holders. Sections of the fencing are deteriorating, not least with broken and damaged posts. A Councillor had attended "**The Gipping Way of the Cross**" presentation at the Cathedral in Bury St Edmunds. The presentation which was lead by Rev Andy Buttress and Dr Mike Walker, both from Haughley, is to reinstate the pilgrimage route between Ipswich and the Cathedral. The proposal was well received.

D.Cllr Pearson had arranged for a District Council officer to attend at the proposed junior football pitch to consider the way forward. A working group was agreed to organise the annual **Christmas Tree Lights Switch-on Event** – last Saturday in November (28th). The Council received an update on **Haughley Parish in Bloom** and thanks were offered to the organisers and volunteers. The displays are much appreciated. Information on the use of speed detection equipment and traffic calming measures was received.

Financial information was received and payments for July agreed. A proposal for new email addresses for Councillors was put forward. Information was provided on on-line safeguarding tutorials.

Haughley Parish Council held an **additional meeting on 13 August**, primarily to consider Planning Application DC/26/03207 for a Lawful Development Certificate for **container storage at Tot Hill Service Station**. It was noted that the area for this application differs from the recent withdrawn Planning Application also at Tot Hill Service Station.

Arrangements for running the Community Café on Saturday 5th September were considered. Financial information was received and payments for August agreed. The Council consented to the proposal for parcel collection equipment to be mounted on part of the Pavilion building as part of fund raising for Youth Football and the Scouts in Haughley.

Councillors considered a draft consultation document which will seek views from residents in the Parish of Haughley on ways Haughley could develop over the next 25 years. It is proposed to provide related information at the Community Café in September.

The Council received a copy of a communication from a resident to the developers of the current development site off Station Road about the **loss of trees and sections of hedging**. This is being addressed by the developers. The Council has obtained advance warning that construction of **a new footpath** to a section of **Station Road** will involve traffic light control, whilst **installation of services** for the current development will involve a **road closure**. Relevant dates are not yet available but October and November were mentioned. Further information will be included in the Village News when available.

Mid Suffolk District Council and our District Councillor have offered grant funding towards the cost of the Haughley Neighbourhood Plan Review subject to the new plan including provision to accommodate additional housing which will be allocated by MSDC as part of their new Local Plan.

2026-27 Autumn / Winter Flu and COVID Vaccination Campaign

In line with government guidance, the main 2026-27 autumn / winter flu and COVID vaccination campaign commences on 1st October.

Eligibility for a Flu Vaccination

- Aged 65 years and over;
- 18 – 64 years at clinical risk;
- Those in long stay residential care homes;
- Carers of elderly or disabled persons;
- Close contacts of immunocompromised individuals;
- Frontline workers in a health and social care setting.

Eligibility for a COVID Booster

- Residents in a care home for older adults;
- All adults aged 75 years and over;
- Patients aged 6 months and over who are immunosuppressed.

At Woolpit Health Centre we will kick off the campaign with two large clinics as follows:

Saturday 3rd October – COVID and Flu for patients over the age of 75 years ONLY

Wednesday 7th October – Flu ONLY for eligible patients under the age of 75 years

We will then plan smaller clinics for patients unable to make these dates.

Eligible patients will receive an invitation via a mobile phone text or by letter, depending on how they have consented for us to make contact. There may be occasions where patients of the same household have different appointment times. In this event patients can attend together at either time, without the need to inform us.

Housebound patients will be notified of their vaccination date by telephone.

During this busy time, we try hard to minimise disruption to our core primary care services, protecting our Care Navigators so they can remain focused on supporting patients who need triaging into urgent and routine appointments. During the season our small, dedicated vaccination team handle large numbers of telephone and email enquiries.

Request to Patients

1. Please **wait** for your invitation.
2. Upon receipt please only contact the team if you need to change your appointment or cannot use the mobile phone booking link.
3. Our preference is for email contact as this keeps the phone line free and is an efficient way to communicate. Please email: **woolpit.covid19queries@nhs.net**
4. If you need to phone our dedicated vaccine line, the number is **01359 243933**.
5. **Finally, we ask you please to be patient, whichever way you contact us we will get back to you. There is no need to leave multiple messages, this only slows down our responses. Be reassured, we have plenty of vaccine and plenty of appointments.**

We look forward to another successful vaccination season.



The Joy of Doing Things Slowly at Orchard Barn

There are times when it feels as though the whole world is speeding up. Faster communication, faster travel, faster decisions. We seem to have become rather good at hurrying.

At Orchard Barn, we spend time doing things that modern life might consider wonderfully inefficient. We make string from nettles, sharpen old saws rather than buying new ones, repair timber frames instead of replacing them, and build with earth, timber, straw and lime – materials that have served us well for centuries.

It would certainly be quicker to do many of these things another way.

Yet, when we slow down, something unexpected happens. We notice more. We learn from one another. We value skills handed down through generations and take greater care, not just of the task in hand, but of the people alongside us. Perhaps slowing down isn't really about doing less. Perhaps it's about noticing more.

If that thought resonates with you, why not come and experience it for yourself? We welcome volunteers every **Wednesday and Friday, 9am–1pm**, for traditional carpentry and greenwood work, and every **Thursday, 9am–1pm**, to help care for the orchard, gardens and wildlife.

No experience is needed – just a willingness to learn, share and enjoy the simple pleasure of slowing down.

Mid Suffolk

I hired a company to install concrete fencing and a gate in my back garden. The quality of the work is poor, some wooden panels are loose, and the gate doesn't shut properly. I paid before I inspected the work. What can I do?

When you put your trust in a trader and they don't meet your expectations it can be frustrating.

When there's a problem caused by a trader, you should be able to get it fixed or get some money back. Evidence is important - take photos and make notes about what happened and when, including times and dates, and keep hold of receipts or other proof of payment.

People can experience different types of problems with traders, and there's specific advice available on our website depending on what the issue is. In your situation, it's important to note if a trader hasn't done a good job with 'reasonable care and skill', the Consumer Rights Act 2015 entitles you to ask for the problem to be fixed or for a refund.

This is something you can mention when you take the problem up with the trader and cite your evidence. They should fix the problem within a reasonable amount of time, without causing you too much inconvenience. The law doesn't say what counts as reasonable, so you'll have to agree on it with them.

If they can't or won't fix the problem, you can ask for a partial or full refund, depending on how bad the problem is. You'll have to come to an agreement about how much you should get. It's a good idea to start by suggesting a figure and explaining why you think it's reasonable, then take it from there. Once you've agreed on the amount with the trader the law says you should get your refund within 14 days.

If you can't come to an agreement, or they refuse to fix the problem or give you a refund, there are other steps you could take - including complaining to your card provider if you paid by card.

You can check if the trader is a member of a trade association or quality scheme. If they are, they might have to follow certain rules, and if they've broken them, you could get help to take your complaint further. They might be part of an alternative dispute resolution (ADR) scheme - a way of solving disagreements with a trader without going to court - or they might agree to use one.

If the trader isn't part of an ADR scheme, and you've already complained to your card provider and the complaint isn't resolved, you may be able to complain to the Financial Ombudsman Service.

Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk can provide in depth advice on this issue and much more, including debt, finances, employment, benefits and family/relationships.
