ANNE SULYARD

Born Anne Andrews in Baylham in 1442, Anne went on to marry two powerful men, and raised five children who became linked to other powerful families across East Anglia.

But, study of Anne's Last Will & Testament of 1519 reveals the concerns and faith of a staunchly Catholic widow as she negotiated the pre-Reformation turmoil of England under Henry VIII.

Five hundred years on, her list of charitable bequests, and the light-filled manner of her planned leaving of "this Vale of Misery", also shed light on life at Wetherden Hall as it became the focus of 'The Manor of Haughley with its Members' until the late sixteenth century.

The 50 minute talk was well-researched and was well-received by the audience, most of whom stayed on afterwards to enjoy the light refreshments provided.
